

Dental Implants: A Guide for Patient

What is a Dental Implant?

A dental Implants is titanium screw that is placed into your jawbone, replacing a missing tooth root. After this has been fitted, your bone will fuse to the implant and create a sturdy, solid connection and foundation for a false tooth to be fitted on top of the implant. They are designed to match the colour and shape of the adjacent teeth.

What Types the Components of a Dental Implant?

- Implant Fixture: The titanium post resembles a typical household screw. This is the implant fixture and this then becomes inserted into the jawbone. This fixture serves as the root of the new tooth and requires a minor surgical procedure.
- **Abutment:** Once the implant has fully integrated with the jawbone, a small connector called an abutment is attached to the implant. The abutment protrudes from the gum line and is the attachment point for the dental crown or artificial tooth.
- Dental Crown: The dental crown is the visible part of the dental implant that resembles a natural tooth. This is exceptionally natural looking and provides a great aesthetic appearance. It will match the colour, shape, and size of the adjacent teeth.

- Improved function: Dental implants function like natural teeth, allowing you to eat, speak, and smile.
- Aesthetics: Dental implants look and feel like natural teeth. The results enhance your smile and overall facial appearance.

- Bone preservation: Dental implant prevent bone loss and preserve facial structure.
- No impact on adjacent teeth: Implants do not require the alteration of adjacent healthy teeth. Unlike other treatment solutions such as bridges or dentures.
